Following government guidelines, from March 13, 2023, mask-wearing in this Museum will be left up to individual judgment. Please be considerate and respect other people's independent judgement, not forcing anyone to wear or remove a mask against their will.

Keep helping us prevent the spread of COVID-19

Avoid entering the Museum in any of the following cases:

- ★If your body temperature is one degree or more above your normal temperature
- ★If you have symptoms such as cough, sore throat, etc.
- ★If you have been in close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19

Please cooperate with body temperature checks upon entry to the Museum.

We also kindly ask you to cooperate with cough etiquette, regular hand washing, and hand disinfection during your visit.

In order to protect visitors and staff from infection, for the time being we will encourage our staff to wear masks.

Moreover, in case we anticipate a large number of guests attending an event or similar, we may recommend visitors to wear masks.

Inform the staff if you feel unwell during your visit.

Exhibition rooms are ventilated through a fresh-air circulation system, but be sure to keep an appropriate distance from other visitors and staff.

※Appropriate distance = far enough not to touch each other

Entry may be restricted when the Museum is very crowded. We will post info about congestion levels on the official website and SNS (Twitter, Facebook, etc.).
